

INQUIRY #3 OF LOCAL AND STATE CIVIL OFFICIALS: THE BORDER PROTECTION RATIONALE FOR RETURN TO THE ARTICLES OF CONFEDERATION

I have some additional questions regarding our national constitution:

The Federal Supreme Court has ruled that immigration control is an exclusively federal power; the states may not regulate in the area of immigration, even though the Federal Government has done a miserable job at it for decades: "The Federal Government has broad constitutional powers in determining what aliens shall be admitted to the United States, the period they may remain, regulation of their conduct before naturalization, and the terms and conditions of their naturalization ... Under the Constitution, the states are granted no such powers; they can neither add to nor take from the conditions lawfully imposed by Congress upon admission, naturalization and residence of aliens in the United States or the several states." The Founders greatly distrusted a strong centralized government, as evidenced by the weak Articles of Confederation that they wrote to organize the country." Nevertheless, the states are hamstrung by the Federal Constitution in doing this.

The Articles of Confederation read: "every state shall always keep up a well regulated and disciplined militia, sufficiently armed and accoutered, and shall provide and constantly have ready for use, in public stores, a due number of field pieces and tents, and a proper quantity of arms, ammunition and camp equipage." Each state was empowered and allowed to stop invasion by foreigners.

Is not the proper response to the loss of border control in the USA a return to the Articles of Confederation which will empower states and localities to do this job which the Federal Government has not done?
